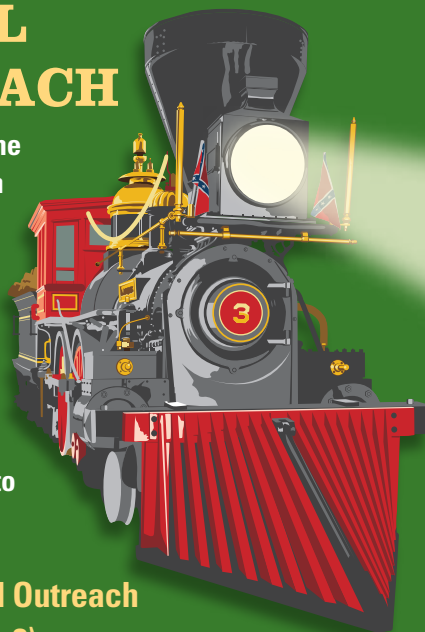


SCHOOL OUTREACH

Program Information

Single class visits for schools in the Cobb County School district are \$75 (40 student maximum); each additional class is \$40. A standard mileage fee will be charged. Outreach programs are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis.

Enjoy a guided tour of the Smithsonian-affiliated Southern Museum with one of our knowledgeable docents. Your visit will include our three permanent exhibits: *The Great Locomotive Chase* (including the world famous *General* steam locomotive),



Railroads: Lifelines of the Civil War and *Glover Machine Works: Casting a New South*, as well as our current travelling exhibition in the Cobb Energy Special Events Gallery (call or visit our website for exhibit schedule). Tours also include the Second World War French *Merci* boxcar, a viewing of *The Story of the Locomotive Chase* in our theater, and time to visit our gift shop.

BUS GUIDES AND HISTORIC SPEAKERS

Our knowledgeable museum staff can adapt specific tours to accommodate your group's interests. Cost is \$75 per hour for the 1st hour and \$50 for each additional hour.

The Southern Museum's staff is also available to provide your adult or community group with a specialized historic lecture or program. Each program lasts approximately 45 minutes. These programs are **FREE OF CHARGE** to local civic, community, and service groups within the Greater Kennesaw geographic area during normal museum operating hours; otherwise minor fees may apply. MUSEUM HIGHLIGHTS TOUR

Explore the permanent exhibits at the Southern Museum and learn about the strategic and economic importance of railroads during the Civil War. Visit with a Union or Confederate soldier; see the *General* steam locomotive; rediscover the *Great Locomotive Chase* in our theater; hear stories associated with the French *Merci* boxcar located in the Jolley Education Center; and experience the operation of an early 20th century factory. Our most comprehensive tour of the museum!

INDUSTRIALIZED AMERICA

Learn about the Industrial Revolution and its significant role in forging a new America following the end of the Civil War. Become acquainted with the function of railroads and other industries in the redevelopment of the economic and social structure of the *New South* beginning with Reconstruction into the 20th century. Galleries recreate the *Glover Machine Works* (a Marietta, GA factory as it appeared during the early 1900s), including a full-scale reproduction of the belt-driven locomotive assembly line.

A NATION DIVIDED

Find out the causes and consequences of the Civil War. Investigate numerous aspects of the period while touring galleries containing examples of original weapons, accoutrements, uniforms, musical instruments, and civilian items. A Civil War soldier will talk with students and present a musket demonstration. See the famous steam locomotive the *General* and an actual Medal of Honor associated with its capture. Meet James J. Andrews, William Fuller and other historic characters in our acclaimed movie, which dramatically recreates the *Great Locomotive Chase*.

Add a walking tour of Big Shanty or a Scavenger hunt for your students at no extra charge! Add-ons can be adapted to any appropriate grade level (3rd grade and up).

JUNIOR RAILROADERS

(Pre-K – Tour size: 10 – 40 children – 1 hour)

Hands-on activities in the Jolley Education Center and the Georgia W. Pierce Pre-K Area allow children to discover and learn while having fun in the museum! This program is designed to introduce young learners to the Southern Museum. Staff will customize a tour to your choice of Pre-Kindergarten themes and content standards.

OUR HISTORIC COMMUNITY

(K through Grade 2: Tour size: 10 – 200 students, 1 ½ - 2 hours)

Museum exhibits provide the basis for learning about the contributions of various historical workers, male and female, of the Civil War era and into the early 20th century. Students learn about the world of work and the importance of providing goods and services within our community.
